


Grace & Trinity Newsbites

The general theme for Wednesday Christian Ed this year is “Disciples are good neighbors”; which continues from last year’s working theme of ‘Being disciples’. Really that’s the topic every year! For disciples, Christian Education, that is faith forming, is a lifelong process. We begin as children learning the basics of our faith, and the teachings of our denominations. Confirmation or affirmation of baptism is a time when young people affirm that they wish to continue living into the promises their parents made for them at their baptism, and be members of a community of faith. Then the rest of our lives are spent figuring out how to be faithful disciples, to live according to the command of Jesus to love one another, to serve one another. As Paul writes in Romans 12 to: “present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. ²Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect. ⁹Let love be genuine; hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good; ¹⁰love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honor. ¹¹Do not lag in zeal, be ardent in spirit, serve the Lord. ¹²Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer. ¹³Contribute to the needs of the saints; extend hospitality to strangers.”

We keep studying and praying the Word, learning & discerning together, worshiping, praying, confessing and being fed at the Table together. All so that we might be faithful disciples, proclaiming the Gospel through our actions (and the occasional word), living out our primary citizenship which is God’s realm, living into our primary identity which is baptized, beloved child of God.

are all ways to be of assistance to neighbors in need – those far away and those nearby. People whose lives have been devastated by natural disasters – derecho in Iowa, hurricanes in the Gulf Coast, fires in California and Colorado and those by human caused disasters – Beirut most recently.

Table Grace Ministries is more local – a ministry out of Omaha that runs a Café and Food Truck which provide healthy meals. People pay as they are able. They also have Catering for a Cause that supports this ministry. A 10-day job training program that helps folks learn basic job skills. A music with a mission and open faith discussion fellowship that welcomes anyone to come and hear music and talk about faith. Also, opportunities to volunteer for those who are able to be in Omaha. I mention them because they are an example of loving and serving neighbors in a very practical and doable way, right here in ‘our neighborhood’. I am hopeful that we might give support to their ministry by having them come to West Point with the Food Truck. They would provide music, leadership and preaching for a service and serve a meal afterwards. Maybe in October, for an outside service – if not the last, the next to last before the weather turns. The cost to have them here is approximately \$1000 - \$500 towards that is promised. That may seem like a lot, but it is in support of their mission and ministry – not payment for services. If you’d like to make a special gift towards this mission effort, it can be given to either congregation. For the meal after service, we will pay as we are able – just as is done on

a daily basis at the café or food truck in Omaha. People ‘pay’ for their meal with volunteer hours or with money; one might give \$1, another \$10, another \$100! What do you think? Let Pastor or a Council Member know your thoughts.

I know that when times are hard; and finances seem tight, the tendency is to hunker down and live out of a model of scarcity and fear. There isn’t enough so we better keep what we have. The model for God’s realm is generosity – there is enough – for all to have what is necessary. Being a good neighbor, in God’s realm, compels us to turn our focus outward, not to curve in on ourselves (Luther’s definition of sin).

It’s a balancing act, caring for others requires that we care for ourselves; or we won’t be of much use. It’s also a challenge to be bold, strong and unafraid. Let’s keep up with the gymnastics and the wrestling, running the race in which we all win when we run together. In God’s realm we’re all in this together and Christ is our life, our hope and our joy.

GUIDELINES FOR CHURCH SERVICES

Just a reminder - Trinity and Grace have similar guidelines to keep us all safe while we gather for service. We are following CDC guidelines along with recommendations from the United Methodist Conference and the ELCA. These are posted on the doors of the church. In the interest of space - short supply this month - just an amended list is included this month.

Regarding the use of the church buildings: Non-religious, private events will not be allowed for the time being. Decisions regarding non-profits who have regularly used the building will be determined on a case by case basis.

Trinity and Grace are doing due diligence to make sure that when we gather in person in our buildings, we are providing a safe place to worship. However, we are a public gathering; we cannot guarantee that you will not be exposed to COVID19. Please follow health department best practices; and use common sense. If you: are experiencing symptoms that might be COVID 19; have been exposed to the virus, have household members sick; are particularly vulnerable to the effects of the virus; are unable to wear a mask, please worship with us through Facebook, and not in person. Remember, you do not need to have a Facebook account to join a livestream on public Facebook pages.

Church and Worship Service guidelines:

- The offering plates will not be passed around. They will be placed in the back of the Church.
- We are following 6’ physical distancing. If members of your household/family wish to sit together, all must be seated at the same time.
- At Trinity, face masks are encouraged, to protect others! At Grace, face masks are required. There will be some available, but we hope you will bring your own. (Children 2/3 and younger are exempt from this policy.)
- No congregational singing. 😞
- * We are using pre-packaged communion elements for the time being. At Grace you will be given them as you come in. At communion, we will all receive together in our places.

Important note: Since both congregations utilize cleaning crews from Northstar (who are not back at work yet) other regular cleaning is being done by volunteers. **Since groups are starting to meet again, more cleaning, more often, is necessary. Talk with a Trooper (at Trinity) or a council member (at Grace) if you can become part of a regular cleaning crew.**

This too shall pass; treatments & vaccines will be developed. In the meantime, can’t say enough good about an intact sense of humor. Err on the side of concern for the other and compassion for those who are at risk. Focus on worshiping God, praying for one another, hearing the Word, receiving Holy Communion, and being the church in the world, for the world. Be of good cheer; be patient, & be kind!

On to adults! Are you interested in a Bible Study? Is it time for another Wednesday morning study? Are there others up for "The Bible in 90 Days"? We can plan in-person and/or Zoom studies. The inquiring pastor would like to know. Email or text ideas, thoughts, topics...

CALLING ALL HAPPY MOWERS - both congregations rely on folks to sign-up and take turns mowing and trimming. The upside of Grace is you get in a really good walk! The fun of Trinity is you get to use a riding mower! The sign-up sheet is available in the office during the week and posted in the usual place on the weekend.

Salvation Army Food Pantry will be held Saturday, September 19 at Trinity Church UCC/UMC in West Point. It will be a drive through as it has been for the past few months. We will need 10 volunteers, by 7:45/8:00. You cannot volunteer if you have any flu-like symptoms.

Online giving is a helpful tool that makes it easy to maintain regular offerings to the congregation. Grace and Trinity both have a Vanco account set-up. This provides a way to give to the congregation through an automatic withdrawal from your bank account. You set the amount and date you would like it to be given. Once in place you will see the withdrawal show up on your bank statement. Vanco sends a monthly statement to the congregation for recordkeeping. You can make changes to your giving by calling or emailing the office. The form is available by email or paper copy at the office.

Another option is to set up your monetary giving through your banks "online bill payment" system. Most banks offer this service. Typically, you just need the name and address of the vendor, or in this case Trinity Church/Grace Lutheran. Check with your current bank to see if they provide this service. You can set it up to pay on any day and can easily manage your payments and can change the amount or day to send your offering. With most on line payment systems, the church will receive a check from your bank account, that will assist the church to manage and record your giving amount.

Camp receives fundraising challenge
