

One of my favorite questions is from a Mary Oliver poem, "what is it you plan to do with your one wild and precious life?" "God our

God has blessed us" the psalmist writes. Paul wrote to the Romans. "I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. ²Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect." We were talking in Bible study about Christians who face persecution or death rather than deny their faith; we wondered what we would do. The thing is that all of us are faced every day with a choice – to act out of love of God and neighbor or to act out of fear, willful ignorance, pride or self-gratification. We may not face a firing squad but we do face the daily death to self that the Gospel demands of us. We are to present our bodies as holy and pleasing living sacrifices to God – that's our answer to that favorite question of mine. Or rather it is the answer demanded by faith and Gospel living. God has blessed us. That doesn't mean we don't experience sadness or despair or the chances and changes of this broken world. God blessing us means that God has become flesh and dwelt among us and Jesus had sent us the Spirit and we are beloved of God for ever and for always. So what is your plan, so that you might be open to being transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern the will of God? I hope that plan includes time to worship and pray together with other followers of the way; frequent partaking of the bread of life and cup of salvation; regular bible study and conversation with God. With God all things are possible; but we will be less likely to recognize the possibilities if we have not spent time with the glorious impossibility of the Triune God. Make time and space for God in that plan for your one wild and precious life, not conformed to this world, but transformed by God's love for you.
