



Greeting

1 John 1:5-10

This is the message we have heard from him and declare to you: God is light; in him there is no darkness at all. If we claim to have fellowship with him and yet walk in darkness, we lie and do not live out the truth.

In silence we confess the times we have chosen darkness over light and convenient lies over difficult truth.

But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, his Son purifies us from all sin.

In silence we confess the times we have hurt others through our words or deeds.

If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness. If we claim we have not sinned, we make him out to be a liar and his word is not in us.

We confess that we are sinners. We ask forgiveness for the wrong we have done and the good we have left undone. We trust in your mercy, O God, our gracious and loving redeemer. Amen.

Hear this good news, God is faithful. Your sins are forgiven + in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**
