

It helps now and then to step back and take a long view.

The Kingdom is not only beyond our efforts,

it is beyond our vision.

We accomplish in our lifetime only a fraction

of the magnificent enterprise that is God's work.

Nothing we do is complete, which is another way of saying that the kingdom always lies beyond us.

No statement says all that could be said.

No program accomplishes the Church's mission.

No set of goals and objectives include everything.

We cannot do everything, and there is a sense of liberation in realizing this.

This enables us to do something, and to do it very well.

We may never see the end results, but that is the difference between the master builder and the worker.

We are workers, not master builders, ministers, not messiahs. We are prophets of a future not our own.

From Xavarian Missionaries:

Oscar A. Romero, Archbishop of San Salvador, in El Salvador, was assassinated on March 24, 1980, while celebrating Mass in a small chapel in a cancer hospital where he lived. He had always been close to his people, preached a prophetic gospel, denouncing the injustice in his country and supporting the development of popular and mass organizations. He became the voice of the Salvadoran people when all other channels of expression had been crushed by the repression.

This poem was composed by Bishop Ken Untener on the anniversary of the martyrdom of Bishop Óscar Romero on March 24, 1980. Romero was assassinated while celebrating the Mass at Hospital de la Divina Providencia, a church-run hospital specializing in cancer and care for the terminally ill. His funeral was attended by 250,000 mourners from around the world.

(pre)Thanksgiving weekend. We are again worshiping together at Trinity on the Saturday before Thanksgiving. Our Chrisitan Ed group will be singing and assisting in leading the service. Here's a way for everyone to participate. We'd like to have some short videos or photo montage for a powerpoint during the service. The question to answer or topic to 'address' is gratitude. For what are you grateful? How does gratitude work on your heart? Be creative. You could do this as an individual, or family or small group. The videos could be talking, singing, a brief skit... We would need these into the office no later than November 17 so that we can get the power point together.

Annual meetings – yes, it is that time of year again. Both annual meetings will be in December; Grace after service on the 7th and Trinity at 1 PM on Sunday, December 14. (We're trying a standalone meeting this year; with a light lunch.) Three questions I

encourage everyone to consider as we approach these meetings — Why are we here? We being the congregation. Why are you here? Why are we doing ministry together? Annual meetings are part of the work of the church. We do our best to do things decently and in order (as Presbyterians would say); to be wise stewards of what God has entrusted to us; all so that we might be about the mission and ministry God calls us to in this place and time. Giving travel and meeting time, at most, it is an hour or two of your time. Is the work of the church worth as much time as a movie?

The Living Nativity on Main St. is one way we proclaim the Gospel outside our walls. We work together with other Christian brothers and sisters to be sure that the Gospel is seen and heard in the midst of all of our cultural Christmas traditions. I felt I needed to share what a witnessed at Trinity a few Saturdays ago as Jim & I prepared ourselves for an atmosphere of worship. We have a young man in our church, Tim, who lives in a group home. Tim is an important part of our congregation and has some disabilities. His staff, Brendan, brings him to church often on Saturday evenings. Tim, is nonverbal and needs assistance to walk. In fact, he needs assistance with most things. When Brendan brings Tim, they usually sit towards the front. As Brendan was helping Tim up the aisle, Tim decided he had had enough walking (it is a long way from the parking lot into the church, into the sanctuary, then up the aisle!) and simply sat down in the middle of the aisle in the center of the church), 10 minutes before the service was to start. I smiled and watched, wondering, how is Brendan going to handle this?! He looked at Tim and said, "Oh, you need to sit down? OK!" and then he simply sat down with Tim and joined him quietly talking to him for 5

minutes. Never pressuring him or scolding him. Just conversing. Pretty soon, Tim let out a guttural noise and Brendan said, "Are you ready to go sit in the pew? Tim flapped his arms, let out a grunt, Brendan helped him up, the acolyte went down the aisle and lit the candles, the pastor walked down the aisle for the service to begin, but Jesus had already given the sermon! I wiped my tears and turned as Pastor greeted us. Amen!
