On going plastic recycling - we have already kept over 1000 pounds of plastic from landfills; it's being recycled into useable products! Thanks for your efforts to make this work. There are 3 ways you can participate -1. bring your recyclable plastic to either Grace or Trinity. (see the posted flyers if you need a reminder about what can and cannot be recycled). 2. Help with weighing. Fill a large clear plastic bag (provided) with as much plastic as possible; squish, squish, squish! Then use the luggage scale to weigh the bag. Take a photo of the scale; check that you can read the weight. Send that photo to Bev Meyer or to either office. (Bev takes care of reporting the weight. Write a big W or the word weighed on the bag. 3. If you are heading out of town and have room in your vehicle, take a weighed bag to one of the stores (Fremont, Norfolk, Columbus, South Sioux, Omaha area) listed on flyer posted on the bulletin board. Ask at the service department where they'd like it put. You do not have to say where it's from or how much it weighs. Just drop it off.

Living Waters Association - Small Church Grant Program Opens September 15, 2025

The Living Waters Association of the Nebraska Conference United Church of Christ is pleased to announce the opening of the 2025 Small Church Grant Program, beginning September 15, 2025.

These one-time grants are designed to support churches within our association that have fewer than 225 members. Each congregation may apply for up to \$500 in grant funds this calendar year. Please note: Total available funds are limited to \$5,000, so not all applications may be funded.

Eligible Uses for Grant Funds Include:

- Regular or special church events or functions
- Utilities and building maintenance
- Clergy continuing education (including travel)
- Church education events (youth or adult)
- Pulpit supply support

Application Requirements:

- The Data Hub reporting requirement has been waived this year due to system difficulties.
- Association dues must be current.
- A congregation member must be present at the Association Annual Meeting to receive a grant. We encourage all eligible congregations to apply and make thoughtful use of these funds to strengthen ministry and community presence. Stay tuned for more information on the Fall Gathering date. The teacher who manages the pantry told me after the first delivery, "the kids who helped me unload the boxes were visibly relieved to see we had the items ready for when people needed them." She comes to Omaha regularly, so we can keep items at the district office as they come in for her to pick up. This might be a good small group or holiday project and connects us with the northern third of our district.

Camp Fontanelle - They've already produced their 2026 summer schedule and are advertising their fall events. They will be sending out packets to churches soon.

Members and friends of Trinty church,

As you know, the renovation of the north wing is near complete, with minor changes remaining. The remodeling looks great and will be very functional for the daycare center. Trinity Church co-hosted a Chamber Coffee on August 15 with Franciscan Healthcare, and approximately sixty people were in attendance, and all were impressed. I even had 3-4 people come to me and thank the church for all we did to make the daycare center a reality.

The FHC partnership is one way we are being wise stewards of our building. We have known for years that the windows were coming to the end of their useful life and would need replacement. The windows are original to the building and have withstood approx. 60-years of Nebraska weather, which is not always kind to brick and mortar.

Franciscan Healthcare's renovation of the north wing was a blessing as FHC replaced the windows in the north wing; so, Trinity will be responsible for only half of the window replacements. The cost of replacing the balance of the windows will be approx. \$51,000. The quote does not cover the cost of replacing the exterior windows that protect the stained glass in the sanctuary. We know the cost will be approximately \$4500 plus labor per window; but we need to research how to do the work without damaging the stained glass.

Trinity Church has been prudent in managing the land funds, and there are monies available to pay for this much-needed update. Half of the 2024 Octoberfest profits (\$4400) were set aside for building renovation, and we will set aside 50% of the 2025 profits again this fall. Considering the fact the Church has funds available, we don't think a formal fundraiser is necessary, but, if anyone is so moved, a directed gift toward the cost of replacing a Sanctuary window would be greatly appreciated and allows us to continue to have resources to further the mission and ministry of Trinity.

The Council is also planning another project. We have identified the need to paint the hallway, exterior doors, railings, and roof in the church entryway. Plans are to complete this project before winter.
